We can work together or separately

1. Create a cardboard cut-out of Toussaint L'Ouverture, the leader of the Haitian Revolution.
2. Create a cardboard cut-out of an abolitionist, a known/unknown enslaved African, or a known/unknown person who opposed slavery.
3. Create something about Slavery.
4. Create a sign about the end of slavery.
5. Create a poem about the Haitian Revolution or the end of Slavery.
6. Create a song about the Haitian Revolution or the end of Slavery.
7. Dramatise something about the Haitian Revolution or the end of Slavery.
8. Write a pray.
